Creating Sacred Places for Children in K-12

This training series which began several months ago, attempts to help teachers of American Indian children in grades K 12 provide a culturally relevant education that takes place in the regular classroom, includes content related to Indian students' lives, makes students proud, expands to other experiences and enhances learning. Creating sacred places means responding appropriately to students' academic, social, emotional, physical, and spiritual needs. Research has shown that to empower Indian students to learn, their school programs must incorporate their language and culture, involve parents and community as partners, provide appropriate instruction, and use appropriate testing methods. The approach' presented here combines the teaching of various subject areas and reinforces classroom instruction with language and cultural activities by using American Indian literature as a basis for instruction. Matthew Rappold and Rebecca Kidder will present on the P.L. 100-297 which allowed Schools to become a tribally controlled school governed by a Board of Trustees.

Matthew Rappold began his career in public interest law as a public defender for the Rosebud Sioux Tribe following his graduation from University of South Dakota School of Law in 2003. Since that time, he has represented individual Indian and Native American interests in many different capacities.

Mrs. Rebecca Kidder has significant knowledge regarding tribal jurisdictional matters including reservation diminishment claims by states, treaty-based claims, defending tribes and tribal entities against litigation by states and private parties, etc. Mrs. Kidder has also represented tribal entities in securing financing for economic development projects.
